Questions to the Directors

The following are a selection of questions that the Directors have received from people interested in CAMP 2005. Here, Steve and Adrian try to answer them for you.

? Why do we need CAMP?

For the past 15 years we have both worked in the USA with this population of kids on Camp and to be honest loved it. These kids are challenging but so bright, full of energy and creative. Camp simple brings out the best in them and helps them to make friends, socialise and most of importantly have fun! -SK

? Who will be looking after my child?

Our senior staff are all trained professionals who have worked with us already either in the USA or UK. All, of course, are CRB checked and have extensive experience in their areas of expertise.—AE

? How can I pay for Camp?

We have tried to make camp cost effective as well as providing a safe, enjoyable, comfortable and rewarding experience for our campers. On application we require a deposit as we already are receiving applications. We also have introduced a new system of online payment where parents or funders can make deposits and incremental payments on line see below—SK/AE

? Is funding available?

A number of parents have contacted their Social Care and Health Teams, as well as voluntary agencies for funding. Also one camper has started sponsor events to raise money for his fees. We suggest you contact your local support group and social services for more information. Investigate



funds for Children with Disabilities, Grants, Respite Funds etc. Some people are already doing it so ASK! More information I am sure will feature on web forums etc.—SK

New Online Payment Service

In response to an number of enquires, we have added the facility for parents to pay for camp on-line. Using PayPal's secure internet payment system, applicants can now pay their deposit and further payments on-line.
